There must have been twenty bears all swiping into the rushing river and catching fish. There were eagles too. Many eagles, some down on the edges of the river catching their own fish. What a bonanza of wildlife. And then as we were watching, we saw one bear taking her catch to a cave. We thought...could it be? Does she have cubs in that cave? YES, she did and two of them came out to show off. FUN. Two little cubs who couldn't quite get down off the high rocks but one of them actually stood up tall. Both stayed there watched and waited for mom to come back with more food. One bear would get one and then it immediately got away. I mentioned to the guide that that poor bear couldn't keep a fish and he said, "Oh no. He gets them and just wants the females that have roe". Life is good when a bear can be that picky.

Onward we went on to the Le Conte Glacier. We walked on the glacier but getting there was half the fun. We were in a little icebreaker boat and we passed icebergs of all sizes, shapes and some even with color. Some had seals peacefully resting on the slow moving sculptures. And....and we could hear the boat breaking through some of ice floating everywhere under the water. The sounds with the clear ski and cool mist was just perfect. Oh I have great photos.
